Early Birds Breakfast Club and 456 Club We'd like to remind you about our out of school childcare provision. Based in the Community Room, morning sessions start at 7.50am and cost £4.00 per session, or children may also be dropped off at 8.30am for £2.00 per day (breakfast not included). After school care runs until 6:00pm and costs £7.50 per child £5.50 for siblings. A reduced rate of £6.00 (or £4.00 for siblings) is



offered if they attend a school extra-curricular club during session time. Parents may book sessions with Mrs Calder in the school office (Breakfast Club) or with Mrs Bowes-Taylor (456 Club – tracy.bowes-taylor@otleyallsaints.co.uk). Access to the clubs is through the doors facing the car park behind the school kitchen.

Harvest Festival Our first church service of the year is our Harvest Thanksgiving Service on Tuesday 2nd October, and we extend a very warm welcome to all our families to attend. This will be held in All Saints Church, and all the children from Reception to Year 6 will be taking part, with each class contributing to the service. We would like to encourage all who can to donate harvest gifts; these will be added to the church's own collection, and will be passed on to the charity 'Caring For Life' at Cookridge. They are always grateful for gifts of food to help in the support of the young adults in their care, but are particularly pleased to receive packets and tins of food that can be stored for the months to come (please, no baked beans, as they already have an abundance of these!). In selecting gifts we would ask you to consider that your child will be carrying them to church, so a carrier bag would be useful. The service will start at 2.00pm, and parents who attend are welcome to take their children home following the service. Any assistance that can be offered in accompanying the children on the walk to church would be much appreciated.



Macmillan Coffee Morning On Friday 5th October we are joining in with the 'World's Biggest Coffee Morning' to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support. Our Year 6 pupils will host this opportunity to enjoy a drink and a bun with friends in the hall between 9.00 and 10.15am. All the money raised will help make sure that families affected by cancer

have the support of trained nurses and advisers. You can help us, either by baking buns, biscuits and cakes (these should be brought to school on Thursday 4th October) or by coming along during the morning. Hope to see you there!

Celebrating Achievement Assemblies Parents who are new to the school may like to know about our special assemblies, held once a month, which are opportunities for pupils to share with the school news of achievements within or outside the school day. Children typically bring in medals, certificates and photos which demonstrate achievement and progress, and we offer an open invitation to parents to come and join us on these special occasions. The first of these assemblies this year is on Tuesday 25th September at 10.25am. Do come along if you can.

Uniform reminder It is lovely to see pupils so smart in their uniforms at the start of term, and we impressed to see that almost all families have remembered that children should be wearing sensible and comfortable black shoes. With so many similar new items of clothing it is very important that each is named, as we often seem to have a quantity of unclaimed lost property within the first few days. A reminder too that jewellery and nail varnish are not appropriate for school, and should not be worn. Wrist bands are also a health and safety risk and must not be worn.

Music Lessons and Clubs Our music teachers will be starting lessons next week - cello on Monday, woodwind, brass and guitars on Tuesday, violin on Thursday and drums on Friday. Orchestra will be starting on Monday 24th September, and drama club's first meeting is on Tuesday 25th September. Letters with more details about these clubs will be coming out shortly. Online Payments System After some 'start of the year' glitches, the Schools Cash Office (SCOPay) is now up and running. Parents should now be able to make payments for lunches, trips, music lessons and out of school care using their SCOPay accounts. Parents of children in Reception will receive details of how to set up their accounts once all the children have been admitted. If your child has a school lunch, please check to

Parking Outside School As we start the new school year I would like to remind parents that, if you need to drive your child to school, we rely on you to park with due consideration for all our neighbours. Never block someone's drive – even for a short time – and do consider accessibility for buses and other vehicles passing school. Trinity Rise, the street to the rear of the school grounds, has no suitable parking, and should not be used by our parents' vehicles. Thank you for your consideration and good manners.



Parent Governor Our school could not function fully without the support and oversight of our Governing Body. One of our parent governors, Andrew Abraham, has stepped down this term, and we are looking for a replacement. All parents of children at the school who meet the required criteria may stand as a candidate and vote in any election. A nomination slip is attached. If you wish to offer yourself as a candidate to become a parent governor you should complete the slip and return it to the headteacher by Friday 21st September. Please note that you are not eligible to be a parent governor if you work

at the school for more than 500 hours per year. You are also not eligible to be a governor if you fulfil any of the disqualification criteria listed on the eligibility form. If only one nomination is received then that person will automatically be declared a governor. If there is more than one nomination then a ballot of all parents will be held to select the parent governors. For this purpose nominees are invited to prepare a short statement which will be circulated with the ballot forms. Space for this is included below the nomination slip. The length of the statement should not be more than 200 words. (The headteacher has the right to reduce any statements over and above this limit).

Parent governors, together with staff representatives, governors appointed by Leeds City Council and representatives from the local community and All Saints Church, share in the important job of running the school. No special qualifications are needed other than a commitment to the school and some time to spare. The bringing together of governors from different backgrounds in itself provides a wide range of skills that can benefit the school. Please note that elected governors will be asked to complete a self-declaration proforma to confirm that they are eligible to serve as a governor. Leeds City Council does offer training and support for governors so no parent should feel deterred from putting themselves forward as a school governor. Parent governors serve a four year term of office irrespective of whether their child leaves the school during the term of office.
