Mr Robertson will be leaving to take up the headship at Kirkstall Valley Primary School, and we will also be losing Mrs Timmins from our school office as she moves to become business manager at Burley St Matthias Primary School. We will also be saying goodbye to Miss Akam and to Miss Doran, as their maternity covers draw to a close. We will miss them all hugely, and would like to thank them for all their hard work and support. In September Mrs Mayo will be reducing her teaching hours, and so will be sharing responsibility for Year 2 with Miss Latchford. Mrs Binks will join Mrs I'Anson in Year 3, and our new deputy headteacher, Miss Dales, will be the teacher in Year 6. We will also be welcoming back Mrs Lewis to Year 4. Other teachers will continue to teach in their present classes (Mrs Anderson – Nursery, Miss Wilson – Reception, Mrs Nunn – Year 1, Mrs Morley and Mrs Fortune – Year 5). **New phone system** Parents contacting the school by phone will have noticed that they will now receive options (ably voiced by our own Mrs Calder!), including the facility to record your child's absence. This is helpful to our office staff at the start of the day; however, it does not give us the opportunity to remind parents of ill children about the regulations regarding sickness. Please remember that a child who has been sick should not return to school until 48

hours have elapsed, to avoid spreading infection. Please help us to keep our children healthy.

**Road Safety** In these warmer days we have received messages from a number of concerned neighbours about the conduct of our pupils on the streets. While the estate roads all have a 20mph speed limit, this does not mean that children are invulnerable, and when they cycle, scooter or skate board on roads unsupervised there is often a danger of serious injury. We are particularly concerned about children and families who access the school by using the drive to the car park – this is used by vehicles at all hours, and should not be used by pedestrians at any time. Our Year 4 pupils benefited from some road safety instruction this week, and we are hopeful that they will now be able to set an example for others to follow.
